TECHNIQUE

Practice drawing animals in a stylized way.

Basic Shapes Box-in Shapes

INSTRUCTION

Remember, basic and block-in shapes can be used to identify the proportions of an animal. These techniques can be taken a step further by applying a style to the animal to create a unique final piece.



Example of a bird drawn in a stylized form. This style utilizes gemeotric patterns within the basic shapes of the animal.

Examples of Different Styles That Can be Used



Pattern Style
The print of the animal's coat extends beyond the animal.



Ribbon Style

The animal takes on a graphic design/industrial look with linear elements and shapes.




Variety of mediums (colored-pencil, pastel, acrylic paint) are used to create the animal on a non-traditional material (newspaper, cardboard, etc).



Watercolor
This method celebrates the features of watercolor and the effects of washes for form the animal.
